After an exciting 2023, FamilyForward enters 2024 with the power of positive momentum and a renewed passion to serve low-income, working families in the northwest suburbs. Our year-long 20th anniversary celebration was truly inspiring. THANK YOU to all who have supported this journey, empowering us to fulfill our important mission.

In addition to our anniversary celebration, we achieved a number of other milestones in 2023:

We served 133 family members through our programs. We implemented a new and innovative debt-reduction matching program. We celebrated the one-year anniversary of the creation of our FamilyForward Advisory Board (now up to 20 active members!). And, we hosted our most successful *Giving Hope* fundraising event ever (see all the details at family-forward.org/blog).

New milestones on the horizon

We plan to continue to reach new milestones in 2024. We are embarking on a strategic-planning process to review, reflect on, and re-evaluate the organization's priorities toward fulfilling our mission. We are committed to finding new and inventive ways to address the mounting challenges our client families face.

Because the availability of affordable housing continues to be a major problem, we spearheaded the formation of a coalition of northwest suburban nonprofits, faith organizations, government entities and interested citizens around this issue. This group is committed to working together to advocate on the local and state levels to find affordable-housing opportunities to build stronger, safer and more vibrant communities. We are grateful to now have the expertise and partnership of Joining Forces for Affordable Housing to help guide us in this process. Evanston, Ill., based Joining Forces, a program of Connections for the Homeless, focuses on affordable-housing advocacy and serves more than 40 municipalities across northern Cook County.

Meeting clients — and supporters — where they are

The families in our program are dealing with a multitude of obstacles, with no easy solutions. We must stay vigilant, and relevant, and meet our clients where they are, especially during these ever-changing times. We are always looking for ways to build awareness of FamilyForward, to grow our reach and engage more donors, volunteers, partners and clients. We welcome the opportunity to speak at community meetings as well as social gatherings such as faith groups, book clubs, and more. FAMILY SUCCESS STORY FINDING THE FINANCIAL BREATHING ROOM TO HEAL AND GROW

"Ellie" had recently become a single mom when she entered the FamilyForward program. With housing in flux, decreased income during the pandemic, and a challenging child-custody schedule, Ellie's life was in upheaval. When she entered our program, Ellie had less than \$500 in the bank and debt totaling more than \$20,000. She also had some serious health problems that she had left untreated for years, due to long-term stress in her life.

Getting housing and finances in order

The FamilyForward rent subsidy allowed Ellie to catch up on bills and chip away at her debt.

As pandemic restrictions began to decrease, resulting in fewer shutdowns, Ellie was able to increase her hours at work and grow her hourly wage. With stable housing and regular coaching visits from her volunteer mentors, Ellie's life was no longer in turmoil. Two years after she started at FamilyForward, Ellie now earns more, has paid down a significant amount of debt, and has brought up her credit score by more than 300 points.

Escaping survival mode leads to healing

For Ellie — and for many FamilyForward participants — the benefits of our program were more than just financial. Because she had some financial breathing room, and because she knew her housing was stable, Ellie started to address some of her ongoing health concerns.

For years before beginning our program, Ellie had been putting off dealing with her health problems. She was living with chronic pain and spending money on symptom management instead of treatment or a cure. Simply put, she had been existing in survival mode.

Once in our program, Ellie felt empowered to find the right specialists, undergo effective medical procedures, and finally receive much-needed treatment. Ellie's volunteer mentors encouraged her to address her own health, because financial stability depends on the wellness of the parent, inside and out.

Ellie's story is an example of "success" that cannot be quantified. With monthly rent support from FamilyForward and encouragement from her mentors, Ellie gave herself permission to finally get her own health under control. Now that she is pain-free, Ellie is a better parent and a better worker.

As with so many FamilyForward participants, the most meaningful part of the experience for Ellie was not about money — it was about relationships, and the support and respect she received. In her final review, Ellie wrote: "I have experienced tremendous personal growth. I was treated as a smart, capable mom." Ellie's mentors provided the encouragement she needed to heal and grow, making a difference in her life for years to come. *Visit family-forward.org/blog for more family stories*.

SHARING STORIES OF SUCCESS

What's the secret to FamilyForward's success? In short, it's our leadership. Over the past 20+ years, leaders at FamilyForward, formerly known as Faith Community Homes (FCH/FF), have led the development and growth of our family program while widening and deepening our base of support.

We recently connected with several of these long-time leaders to collect their insights. It was encouraging to hear their memories, stories and favorite highlights from the past two decades. What emerged was a clear picture of the most significant objectives, strengths and achievements of FCH/FF — encapsulated in five key objectives — and primary markers of success:

MENTORING FAMILIES. At the top of the list is the success of the mentoring component of the family program. Tim Wayman, current board chair and board member since 2009, sums it up: "Mentoring of families with guidance by professional social workers [including current Program Manager Sarah Harte and Case Manager Pam Van De Walle] is the differentiator and key element of our program. Challenging families to reach their goals while providing necessary support makes all the difference."

EXPANDING REACH. Another major highlight for FCH/FF was the expansion of services beyond Arlington Heights and across the northwest suburbs. The expansion into Palatine, followed by reaching into Elk Grove Village, Hoffman Estates, Mount Prospect, Prospect Heights, Rolling Meadows, Schaumburg and Wheeling, "was significant, as it marked the growth, maturity and broader acceptance of the concept of our program," according to Chuck Warner, executive director from 2010 through 2021.

INVOLVING PASSIONATE LEADERS. The value and achievements of committed board members, staff and volunteers cannot be overstated. "Each board member has something special to add and does so unselfishly. We are extraordinarily blessed by board members and committee volunteers. They are the heartbeat of the organization," says Donna Anderson, FCH/FF co-founder, original and ongoing board member, and former board chair. Additionally, the expert leadership of our executive directors (Chuck Warner, followed by Erica Chianelli), has been critically important in advancing our mission, adds Chris Farnsworth, who joined the board in 2007.

HOSTING SUCCESSFUL FUNDRAISING EVENTS. FCH/FF has hosted many exciting events, including the highly successful annual *Giving Hope* event. These activities have played an important role in getting the word out about FCH/FF and raising critically needed funds to assist families. Jim Mayer, former board chair and board member since 2010, deeply appreciates the family testimonies presented at *Giving Hope* and cites the importance of hearing these stories of remarkable family achievements empowered by volunteers, staff and supporters.

IMPACTING THE COMMUNITY. One the greatest impacts FCH/FF has had on the community has been to raise awareness of "the existence and concerns of low-income families in our suburbs," according to Lou Walton. For Chuck Warner, "the most significant element is simply our presence with families. Financial support, mentoring, all the work to get families to record and justify their expenses, is important and useful. But what makes FamilyForward unique and impactful is to just be with the family, to listen and understand."

Throughout two decades of continued development, growth and expansion, FCH/FF leaders have focused on the five areas of strength outlined above. Along the way they have cherished the journey and celebrated each milestone. But they also know there is much more to do. The work of FamilyForward continues, thanks to these and many other leaders who have stepped up and joined the mission over the years. Here's to another 20 years!
