Executive Director's Message

As I learn about families coming to Faith Community Homes for help, I am often stunned and saddened by the immensity and depth of problems families face. And the numbers of families in crisis is large. The problems and challenges come about for many different reasons: bad decisions, poor relationships, low education levels, and having children before parents can comfortably support them are often cited. But for many families, the problems are generational; their families of origin often faced the same challenges and problems. Additionally, we have come to realize that low-income families sometimes live with a very different understanding and view of the world than those who have not experienced poverty. What one might see as a problem needing to be fixed, another may just shrug and say, "So what, that's just the way we have always lived."

The rising cost of living, especially increased rents, compounds these challenges. In my own lifetime, years back, minimum wage was enough to live on. Working full time, minimum wage was enough to cover my rent and all other living expenses including college tuition at UIC. That is certainly not true today.

At FCH, we work with as many families as possible to not only provide the support they need, but also try to change their outlook on life. We help them experience a different way of looking at and solving problems. With successes, we see families move forward and begin to achieve what they could only dream of two years earlier. Inspiring hope, changing lives.
